SIGNED CONTRACT FOR RAMA HYDRO POWER PLANT, BOSNIA AND HERZEGOVINA

A Consortium, led by KONČAR – Power Plant and Electric Traction Engineering, signed the Contract with the Electric Power Authority of the Croatian Community of Herceg Bosna in Mostar, on 5th April, 2011. The Contract having the value of 17 million Euros was signed within the frame of a complete refurbishment of Rama Hydro Power Plant comprising refurbishment of generators, turbines and on-line monitoring.

Six KONČAR Group Companies participate in the project: KONČAR – Power Plant and Electric Traction Engineering, in the function of the leader and executor of the whole project, erection and transport, KONČAR – Generators and Motors, KONČAR – Institute for Electrical Engineering, KONČAR – Instrument Transformers, KONČAR – Low Voltage Switches and Circuit Breakers and KONČAR – Switchgear. Completion of works on Unit 1 was planned for the middle of 2013, and on Unit 2 for the middle of 2014.

Rama Hydro Power Plant is the largest hydro power plant in Bosnia and Herzegovina. It was put into operation in 1968, and it has been in continuous operation since then – with the exception of short breakages during the war in 1993. The installed power at Rama HPP is 160 MW and the average annual production of electric energy amounts to 650 GWh making some 50 per cent of the annual generation of the Electric Power Authority of the Croatian Community of Herceg Bosna.

In 1968, KONČAR delivered two generators having the power of 2 x 90 MVA with belonging electric equipment to Rama HPP. After the refurbishment, the generator power will amount to 2 x 100 MVA.

With this Contract, KONČAR has continued its successful export of plants and equipment to Bosnia and Herzegovina, one of the most important export countries to which KONČAR has been delivering its products for years.
